#### **Electrical Safety**

### AADANGER

#### HAZARD OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, EXPLOSION, OR ARC FLASH

- Electrical equipment must be installed, operated, serviced, and maintained only by qualified personnel.
- Apply appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) and follow safe electrical work practices.
- Turn off all power supplying the UPS system before working on or inside the equipment.
- Before working on the UPS system, check for hazardous voltage between all terminals including the protective earth.
- The UPS contains an internal energy source. Hazardous voltage can be
  present even when disconnected from the mains supply. Before installing or
  servicing the UPS system, ensure that the units are OFF and that mains and
  batteries are disconnected. Wait five minutes before opening the UPS to
  allow the capacitors to discharge.
- The UPS must be properly earthed/grounded and due to a high leakage current, the earthing/grounding conductor must be connected first.

Failure to follow these instructions will result in death or serious injury.

### **AADANGER**

#### HAZARD OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, EXPLOSION, OR ARC FLASH

In systems where backfeed protection is not part of the standard design, an automatic isolation device (backfeed protection option or other device meeting the requirements of IEC/EN 62040–1 **or** UL1778 5th Edition – depending on which of the two standards apply to your local area) must be installed to prevent hazardous voltage or energy at the input terminals of the isolation device. The device must open within 15 seconds after the upstream power supply fails and must be rated according to the specifications.

- Disconnect charging source prior to connecting or disconnecting battery terminals.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they can explode.
- Failed batteries can reach temperatures that exceed the burn thresholds for touchable surfaces.
- Do not open, alter, or mutilate batteries. Released electrolyte is harmful to the skin and eyes. It may be toxic.

Failure to follow these instructions will result in death or serious injury.

### **AADANGER**

Batteries can present a risk of electric shock and high short-circuit current. The following precautions must be observed when working on batteries:

- Remove watches, rings, or other metal objects.
- Use tools with insulated handles.

- Do not lay tools or metal parts on top of batteries.
- Disconnect the charging source prior to connecting or disconnecting battery terminals.
- Determine if the battery is inadvertently grounded. If inadvertently grounded, remove source from ground. Contact with any part of a grounded battery can result in electric shock and burns by high short-circuit current. The likelihood of such shock can be reduced if such grounds are removed during installation and maintenance by a skilled person (applicable to equipment and remote battery supplies not having a grounded supply circuit).

Failure to follow these instructions will result in death or serious injury.

### **AADANGER**

#### HAZARD OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, EXPLOSION, OR ARC FLASH

When replacing batteries, always replace with the same type and number of batteries or battery packs. Refer to the label in the classic battery cabinet for information on batteries in your system.

# **A**CAUTION

#### **RISK OF EQUIPMENT DAMAGE**

- Mount the batteries in the UPS system, but do not connect the batteries until
  the UPS system is ready to be powered up. The time duration from battery
  connection until the UPS system is powered up must not exceed 72 hours or
  3 days.
- Batteries must not be stored more than six months due to the requirement of recharging. If the UPS system remains de-energized for a long period, we recommend that you energize the UPS system for a period of 24 hours at least once every month. This charges the batteries, thus avoiding irreversible damage.

# Receiving

# **External Inspection**


When the shipment arrives, inspect the shipping material for any signs of damage or mishandling. Check tilt and impact indicators. Do not attempt to install the system if a damage is apparent. If any damage is noted, contact Schneider Electric and file a damage claim with the shipping agency within 24 hours.

Compare the components of the shipment with the bill of lading. Report any missing items to the carrier and to Schneider Electric immediately.

Verify that labelled units match the order confirmation.


# **Remove the Modular Battery Cabinet from the Pallet**

- 1. Move the modular battery cabinet to the final installation area using a forklift.
- 2. Remove the ramp from the top of the cabinet.
- 3. Remove the shipping material.




Receiving Modular Battery Cabinet

4. Remove the shipping brackets.



- 5. Place the ramp and fasten it to the pallet with the provided bolts.
- 6. Roll the modular battery cabinet down from the pallet.
- 7. Move the modular battery cabinet to its installation location and use a wrench to lower the levelling feet. Ensure that the cabinet is level.



1. Remove the conduit box from the rear side of the modular battery cabinet.


#### **Rear View of the Modular Battery Cabinet**



Connect Power Cables Modular Battery Cabinet


2. Rotate the conduit box and install.

### **Rear View of the Modular Battery Cabinet**




- 3. Remove the gland plate from the top or bottom of the conduit box and drill holes for cables/conduits. Reinstall conduits (if applicable) and reinstall the gland plate.
- 4. Remove the right side panel and the top cover.

#### Front View of the Modular Battery Cabinet




Modular Battery Cabinet Connect Power Cables

5. Route the power cables through the conduit box and connect to the busbars.



6. If more than one modular battery cabinet is part of the installation, connect the battery cables between the modular battery cabinets.




**NOTE:** Route the signal cables separately from the power cables.

1. Remove the indicated rubber cover. Cut holes for signal cables.




2. Connect 22 AWG signal cables (not supplied) according to one of the diagrams below.


#### Signal Cables in Systems with One Modular Battery Cabinet



#### Signal Cables in Systems with up to Four Modular Battery Cabinets




3. Route the power and signal cables through conduits or fasten to the cable reliefs.




# **Install Batteries in the Modular Battery Cabinet**

- 1. Lockout/Tagout the BB battery breaker in the OFF (open) position.
- 2. Remove the plate in front of the battery shelves.



- 3. Cut the three cable ties that hold the battery cables to the frame.
- 4. Remove the M6 screws from the battery shelves. Save the screws for future use.




5. Holding the handle, install the battery modules one string at a time from the bottom and up.

# **AAWARNING**

#### **HAZARD OF ARC FLASH**


Be careful not to damage the battery cables when installing the battery modules. Lift the battery cables away from the battery shelves before pushing the battery modules into the cabinet.

6. Push down the handle of each battery module and fasten with the provided screw in front of the battery module.

- 7. Remove the shrink tubes from the power terminals and connect the power terminals to the batteries.
- 8. Reinstall the plate in front of the battery shelves.

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
